 - # Largely as a result of immigration, APAs are the fastest growing group in the United States.
 - # APAs represent a wide cultural and language diversity that encompasses 50 ethnic subgroups and 100 language groups.

Homeownership

- # Homeownership rates for APAs are 17 points lower than for non-Hispanic white Americans
 - # In Minneapolis, Oakland, Seattle and San Francisco, at least 10% of public or subsidized housing were occupied by APAs
